- 1. Evaluate William Wordsworth's use of Romantic elements with reference to his poems on your syllabus.
- 2. Critically evaluate S. T. Coleridge's 'Genevieve' as a love poem.

- 4. Briefly explain the allusion to the mythical figure of Philomela in 'To One Who has been Long in City Pent'.

- 3. What is called the 'last stage of all' in Arnold's 'Growing Old' and why?
